ALFONS EHRSAM †

It is with deep regret that we announce the death of Mr. Alfons Ehrsam, of 3 Woodstock Road, Witney, Oxfordshire, popular figure known as "Alfons of Oxford". He died at the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford, at the age of 72.

He came to this country with his brother Max and worked in London at the Berkeley and Piccadilly Grill and later as Maître d'Hôtel at the Grand in Trafalgar Square. After the first world war he went to Oxford where he took over the "George" which he transformed from a teashop to the best restaurant in Oxford. He presided over this famous rendez-vous from 1921 to 1946. When he retired, he returned to Switzerland on account of his wife's illhealth. But after her death, he returned to Oxford and became Manager of the Royal Oxford Hotel. He married again, and when he left Oxford in 1955, he became proprietor of the Hotel Ehrsam on Osney Bridge. When he finally retired, he went to live at Witney.

Alfons Ehrsam was a great character as well as a good restaurateur. He had a large collection of bow ties, and also a magnificent stamp collection. His stories about Oxford men were inexhaustible.

We extend our deep sympathy to his widow and his two step-sons.
