AMERICAN COLLEGE CHOIR AT THE SWISS CHURCH (ST. MARY WOOLNOTH)

A special treat awaited the congregation at St. Mary Woolnoth's on Sunday morning, 25th June. An American Choir took part in the Service of the German-speaking Community of the Swiss Church in London. It consisted of over thirty members specially selected for the European Tour from the sixty members the A Cappella Choir of Bluffton College, in the State of Ohio. Bluffton College was founded in 1900 and is a Church-related educational establishment emphasising the liberal arts. Its focus is upon the methods of acquiring knowledge, opening to students a variety of intellectual experiences. It has 625 students and fifty faculty members. The College is supported by the General Conference Mennonite Church of North America. The A Cappella Choir is not the only musical organisation on campus, but it is the only group on the European Tour 1967. Their itinerary comprises visits and concerts in many cities and towns in this country, Germany, Czechoslovakia, Austria Italy, Switzerland, Belgium, France and the Netherlands, where the Choir will sing at the Mennonite World Conference in Amsterdam at the end of August.

At the Swiss Church, the Choir sang Heinrich Schutz's 100th Psalm in German, Gustav Holst's "Matthew, Mark, Luke and John", a Negro Spiritual and some smaller items. The quality of the music and of the voices was of an exceptionally high standard and enhanced the Service which was given in English. Afterwards, residents and visitors met over a cup of coffee.

The Choir was conducted most ably by Mr. Earl W. Lehman, and the Director of the educational-study part of the tour, Mr. J. W. Bixel, told the congregation of the Swiss settlers who have kept many of the traditions of their old country, and indeed, out of the thirty members of the Choir, about half have Swiss ancestors. Their names bear witness to this: Oswald, Stockman, Hilty, Gerber, Geiger, Hofstetter, Habeggar, Lehman and such very Swiss family names as Luginbill and Krehbiel, however Americanised.
