REVISION OF THE SWISS FEDERAL CONSTITUTION

A forthcoming NSH Lecture

94 years after the first total revision, followed since by an incredible variety of more or less important additions, it is none too early that a further total revision of the Constitutional Law of the Swiss Confederation is at last being undertaken by our compatriots at home. Much of the verbiage of the last few decades serving purely temporary or secondary needs and interests will have to be eliminated or replaced by ordinary legislative treatment. Other more fundamental amendments need to be properly integrated in the newly formulated constitutional basis of our country to conform in dignity with the requirements of democratic survival in an age that has shed so many ideal beliefs as well as old prejudices and acquired so many new ones.

The problems involved and the intentions of our legislators will be discussed at the next meeting of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique on Thursday, 23rd May, at the Swiss Hostel for Girls (7.45 p.m.), by an eminent lecturer from Switzerland, Dr. Arthur Baur, Editor-in-Chief of “Der Landbote” Winterthur, and for many years before political editor of the “Neue Berner Zeitung”. It will be a first-class opportunity for our Colony to get to know the present plans for the revision, to discuss them and contribute our thoughts on the matter of such importance to the future of Switzerland and therefore also to the Swiss abroad. As usual, the meeting is open to all Swiss and their friends. The subject-matter and the fame of the lecturer who will speak in English are deserving of a numerous attendance.
