Several of our subscribers in the Diplomatic Service have recently been appointed to new posts.

Early in April, we heard that Monsieur l'Ambassadeur **Erwin Bernath** (in London from 1951 to 1956) and Swiss Ambassador in Denmark since 1964, has been moved to Ottawa.

The Swiss Ambassador in Norway, Monsieur **Pierre-Henri Aubaret**, has been appointed Consul-General in New York.

Mid-April we were informed of the appointment as the Federal Council's Delegate with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development in Paris (OECD) of Ambassador **Marcel Heimo** (in London from 1961 to 1966) and only a short time *en poste* in India and Nepal.

Last but not least, Monsieur l'Ambassadeur **Jean de Stoutz**, Swiss Ambassador to Israel since 1964 when he left London, has been given the post recently vacated by Ambassador Lindt in Moscow. He was already in Russia from 1952 to 1956 and is the fourth Swiss Ambassador to the Soviet Union since diplomatic relations were taken up after the war.
