## THE SWISS ECONOMIC COUNCIL DINNER

The Swiss Economic Council has arranged a series of Dinners which will be held during the forthcoming months. The first of these dinners took place at the Dorchester on October 1st and was honoured by Monsieur René Keller. The evening's speaker was Mr. J. L. Gilliéron, President of the Swiss Chamber of Commerce in France. His theme was the Common Market and France's attitude towards British entry. Mr. Gilliéron was fairly optimistic about the chances of a successful British application. One of his main points was that the agricultural difficulties entailed by British participation had been over-emphasised and could be resolved. Psychological problems, he believed, would be much more difficult to overcome, although he had noted a tremendous improvement on both sides of the Channel in this re-

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spect. Without being a European idealist and sharing a typically Swiss reserve on this matter, Mr. Gilliéron acknowledged the economic advantages of a large, homogenous and rationalised European market.

ings of top organisations in Swiss Communities abroad.
