Mr. Franz Bischof, Vice-Consul will be leaving us at the end of December. He is to take up a new assignment in Accra, Ghana. The Nouvelle Société Helvétique, the Swiss Hostel for Girls, the Schweizerbund and all the Swiss of London who knew him will regret his departure. Mr. Bischof succeeded Mr. F.
