THE PADDINGTON GRAPE HARVEST

It has been an excellent year for the grape growers of Bayswater.

The proud owners of vines have been reporting their best harvest ever.

Mr. Adolph Schmid, of the Norfolk Court Hotel, has already picked more than 50 bunches from the vine growing up the front of the hotel in Norfolk Square. He estimates there are another 20 bunches still on the vine.

"It is the best year we have ever had," he said. "Last year we picked only a couple of bunches."

Mr. Schmid planted the vine 25 years ago. It is a cutting from the famous vine at Hampton Court.

Councillor Mrs. Trixie Gardner has this year for the first time been able to pick grapes from the vine at her home in Porchester Terrace.

Planted three years ago, the vine has yielded some 40 bunches of white grapes.

FOOD FARM

More than 15,000 people have now visited the food farm in Switzerland where Bio-Strath, the herbal yeast food supplement and tonic, is made.
