On the other hand, if you have so far refrained from joining for one reason or another, please read on.

The Fund was started by and for Swiss living abroad; it is a "self-help institution" dating back to 1958. Since then, the Fund has paid out several million francs to nearly 400 members, enabling them to start a new existence which they had lost due to war, political unrest and upheaval, including nationalisation effects and similar events.

We must realise, however, that the solidarity community can only help the one who himself made a contribution towards solidarity originally. And just in case you are still not convinced that such a contribution, such a gesture is worthwhile, we should like to remind you that, unlike an insurance premium, most of the financial contribution will be paid back. If you make a one-time payment, you get a full 100% back al-

ready after three years, should you wish your membership to cease. The money is safe; for an increase in membership in recent months has enabled the Fund to better its position, and its well-invested assets now amount to well over six million Swiss francs. In addition, the Confederation is a guarantor—what better security could one ask for?

To sum up: you make annual payments from between £2/9/0 and £39/4/0 which entitles you to a hundredfold compensation in case of loss of livelihood as described above. Or you make a one-time payment from between £44 to £708 with corresponding benefits. Your contribution towards the solidarity principle is that you forego the interest. That's all.


