COMPANY NEWS

Acrow

Acrow (Engineers) Ltd. have announced a pre-tax profit, up 13.49 per cent from £2,309,449 to £2,618,000 for the year ending 31st March 1971. Mr. W. A. de Vigier, Chairman of the Acrow Group, stated that this was the 26th year of uninterrupted record profits and growth. He said that the present financial year was a challenging one in view of the Company's recent takeover of the Steel Group—Coles Cranes and Priestman Excavators. Although it was still too early

to assess the effects of the takeover of the Steel Group, Mr. de Vigier indicated that the first four months of the present year were the best ever for Acrow for both turnover and profit.

The figures quoted above apply only for the Acrow group of companies in the UK, for which Acrow (Engineers) Ltd. acts as holding company. They do not include the results of the various Acrow interests across the world.

Adamson & Hatchett Ltd., a division of Acrow, controlling about 50 per cent of the container market in the UK, is one of the leading British exhibitors at the "Kontainery '72" Exhibition currently staged at Leninograd. Russia will need between 16,000 and 20,000 containers during the next years and some 40,000 within the present five-year plan. In view of this demand, Adamson & Hatchett Ltd. have announced that they are geared to provide the Russians with a complete turn-key project including manufacturing techniques, know-how, equipment for container repair and transportation.
