New Reservations Manager for Swissair London

Brown Boveri

Brown Boveri static power supply system, the first of its type to be ordered for a large-scale UK computer

installation, has been operating continuously since November 1971 in the London Hospital Computer Centre at Whitechapel.

This system renders the Hospital's two UNIVAC computers immune from power blackouts, and maintains power to the whole computer complex for thirty minutes. Subsequently, a diesel generator may be installed to supply power to the system, enabling uninterrupted processing during power-breaks of more than one hour.

THE ROYAL NAVY GREETS SWITZERLAND

At Samedan, in the Upper Engadine, a ceremony of a special kind was celebrated on 18th August.

The Commander of the Royal Navy's aircraft carrier "Engadine," Captain B. H. Rutterford, together with his family, paid a visit to the Engadine, the Swiss valley that gave his ship her name. The Grisons Tourist Office organised a Reception in Captain Rutterford's honour, which was attended by many local dignitaries.

GENEVA MAYOR VISITS MANCHESTER

A party of Geneva officials led by Mrs. Lise Girardin, Mayor and Delegate of the Council of States in Berne, flew to Manchester on an outing marking the opening of the Geneva-Manchester route by BEA. This follows the opening last year of the Manchester-Geneva link when the Lord Mayor of Manchester visited Geneva.

The Genevese delegation was met at Manchester Airport by the Lord Mayor and drove in a procession of black limousines to the huge and Gothic Town Hall, decorated by Swiss and British flags which were hanging limp in the rain. A Dinner was held in its precincts at the end of the day. Besides town officials from Manchester, the mayors of Blackpool and Chester were among those who attended this function. The party had made an outing to these two towns during the day and had also visited General Consul Rolf Born of Manchester. Mr. Born had the opportunity of greeting his British counterpart, Mr. Evans, British Consul in Geneva.


