SWISS CATHOLIC MISSION

In a circular, the Chairman of the Committee of Swiss Catholics in London, announced that the traditional fund-raising Christmas Draw would not be organised this year. Proceeds from the Draw had diminished from £333 in 1970 to £240 last year partly because of the sharply increased cost of printing Draw tickets and also because of increased postage rates.
