Mr. Bruno Frei, one of our readers
and the only Swiss that we know of in
the bespoke trade in London, was
recently appointed a director of the firm
he has worked for during the past two
years, Maurice Sedwell of Saville Row.
Mr. Frei, who is also an indispensable
organiser of the Swiss Catholic Youth
Club and can be seen at all its parties at
the John Southworth Centre, came to
England from Switzerland in 1962 for a
one-year study of English — and he's still
here. His first job in this country was
with a leading Swiss tailor of the time,
Mr. J. L. Guggenheim, proprietor of
Peacock and Co. Mr. Frei arrived in
England at 3 p.m. and by 4.30 the same
afternoon was working for this firm as a
coat-maker. Six years later, he joined
Henry Poole and Co. of Cork Street,
London, and two years ago he became the
"right hand man" of Maurice Sedwell,
who runs his own business in Saville Row.

The nominations to a seat of
director was a show of appreciation for
Mr. Frei's contribution to the firm. We
should like to extend our warmest
congratulations for this success and are

glad to note that Mr. Frei is bringing to
England the traditions of Swiss
conscientiousness and workmanship.
