Roche appeal

It has been decided by the British Government not to appeal against a High Court decision which effectively gave Hoffman-La Roche, the Swiss international drugs group, the right to sue the Secretary of State for Industry and the Chairman of the Monopolies Commission. The period in which the Crown and the Monopolies Commission chairman could have lodged an appeal has now elapsed.

In the High Court at the end of last year, Mr. Justice Whitford dismissed applications by the Department of Industry and the Chairman of the Monopolies Commission to have Roche's writ and statement of claim struck out. The group is seeking in its main case to have the commission's report on the controversial tranquilizers, Librium and Valium, overturned.
