A new concept of go-as-you-please holidays in Switzerland, with the price advantage of a packaged holiday, was introduced on 1st April.

The Fly-Rail Switzerland holidays, for two or more people, include economy class air travel by any direct scheduled flight of Swissair, British Airways or Dan-Air, plus a Swiss Holiday Card valid 8 days, 15 days or one month.

The Swiss Holiday Card entitles the holder to unlimited travel by rail, boat and alpine postal coach. Or to be exact on the whole network of the Swiss Federal Railways (1810 miles), on 79 private railways (1414 miles), on the lake boat routes (294 nautical miles or 339 statute miles), and most alpine postal coach routes (2054 miles). All in all, no less than 5600 miles of beautiful journeys within Switzerland. In addition,

reductions of 25%-50% are offered on many funiculars and mountain railways. The Swiss Holiday Card is available for first or second class travel.

The Fly-Rail cost is from £76.00 per person, for return air travel London to Basle or Geneva plus a second class 8-day Holiday Card. Flights to Zurich and Berne and from Manchester Switzerland, with first or second class Holiday Cards valid 8 days, up to 15 days or up to one month, are also available at additional cost.

For children from 6 to 12 years, the cost of Fly-Rail is only about half the adult rate, and two children in this age bracket count as one adult for the minimum group of two adults travelling together. The stay in Switzerland must be for at least eight days and not more than one month, and the Swiss Holiday Card must be valid for the entire duration.

Bookings for Fly-Rail Switzerland can be made with travel agents, airline offices and the Swiss National Tourist Office.
