THE POSTAL COACH HOLIDAY SEASON TICKET is valid for one month. You can travel at half-price on Swiss Routes and at reduced rates on frontier-crossing routes, as well as on organised excursions. On three days of your own choice the ticket is valid for unlimited travel without extra charge.

SWISSAIR CONTINUES TO EXPAND ITS SERVICES

Swissair's summer schedules, effective from 1st April, provide for an increase in services to the Gulf area, a new weekly flight to Oran, Algeria, and a third weekly DC-10 service to Lagos and Accra.

On the UK-Switzerland routes both Zurich and Geneva continue to be served three times daily from London, with most of the morning departures to Zurich by DC-8. London-Basle remains on a daily basis with weekend night flights, and London-Zurich night flights are operated four times weekly. The popular Zurich-London evening flight is also maintained, as is the daily Manchester-Zurich service.

The frequency to Salzburg goes up to six times weekly and weekend night flights are being re-introduced to Copenhagen and Stockholm.

A NEW IDEA — TRAM AND BUS DAY TICKETS FOR ALL SWISS CITIES

An innovation in Switzerland is the introduction of tram and bus tickets valid in all Swiss towns and cities. The Federation of Swiss Public Transport Undertakings, in association with the suburban transport services of more than twenty towns is issuing a booklet costing Sw.Fr.35 containing ten day tickets.

Thus for Sw.Fr.3.50 the user can travel as much as he likes on trams and buses in the towns concerned. The booklets are obtainable at transport undertakings' selling points, Swiss Federal Railways stations and the offices of the ACS and TCS, the two Swiss motorists' organisations and from the SNTO in London.

COME TO SWITZERLAND CAMPAIGN

A top-level team from the Swiss Eurotel chain has carried out an intensive one-week promotion campaign throughout West Germany.

Theme of the campaign — "Switzerland is not expensive!"

The 12-man team included the managers of Eurotel hotels in Switzerland and executives from Eurotel headquarters in Thun.

After opening their campaign in Saarbrücken, they split up into four teams to visit up to 500 travel agencies in 25 major West German cities and towns for discussions with counter personnel.

Said Eurotel assistant manager, Mr. Hans-Peter Göbel: "Travel counter staff are some of the most influential people in the business — it is they, after all, who are in direct contact with the public.

"We do not claim that Switzerland is cheap. But it does give the tourist value for money. This is the message we tried to get across."

Swiss National Tourist Office branches throughout West Germany co-operated in the Eurotel campaign.

WEST SIDE STORY

Restoration work has been completed on the wall which centuries ago formed part of Berne's western defences. The wall stretches from the Lorraine Bridge down to the Bloody Tower. Completed between 1344 and 1346, the wall was still standing at the end of the 19th century. Then it suddenly collapsed. A "protected monument" since 1908, the wall was included in a reconstruction scheme drawn up in 1945 but only now has been fully restored.

GRAND PRIX DE BERNE FOR CLAY PIGEON SHOOTING

More than 100 of the world's top clay pigeon marksmen will be competing in the Swiss capital from 30th April to 2nd May for the 15th Annual Grand Prix de Berne. The event is again being organised by the Berne Shooting Club at its Bergfeld grounds at Berne-Hinterkappelen — acclaimed by leading marksmen as among the most beautiful shooting ranges anywhere in the world.

Incidentally, non-members can also use the club's excellent grounds and facilities.

NEW ACCOMMODATION FOR YOUNGSTERS

The Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) in Switzerland has re-opened the mountain hotel "Jungfraublick" at its holiday centre in Wengen, in the Bernese Oberland, after a complete renovation. It has 42 rooms with bath/shower, library and conference rooms. The guests may choose between full room and board or only one meal a day. New youth centres are being provided at Estavayer-le-Lac on Lake Neuchâtel, at Giswil-Kleintal on the way to the Brunig Pass and on the Hoch-Ybrig (80 beds).

FACILITIES GALORE

Eurotel has opened a new hotel in Switzerland — at the resort of Villars-sur-Ollon. The new Eurotel is the seventh in Switzerland and the 26th in Europe. With 283 beds it is also the second largest of the group's Swiss operations. The Villars-sur-Ollon Eurotel has an indoor swimming pool and conference and banquet facilities for up to 150 people. Guests are also entitled to free or reduced-price transport, ski-ing and other sports facilities in the resort.

UP AND AWAY

British carrier Dan-Air flew a record number of passengers on its increasingly successful London (Gatwick)-Berne route last year — and expects to do even better during 1976.

Total number of passengers carried to and from the Swiss capital in 1975 was 12,159, compared with 4,196 the previous year and less than 3,000 the year before that.

Said Dan-Air Marketing and Development manager, Mr. Brian Brett: "We operated a record number of flights last year and still carried more passengers per flight than ever before.

"We are aiming for at least a further 25 per cent increase in passengers this year and are confident of topping the 15,000 mark."
