OTHMAR ROHN 70

It it with great pleasure that we announce the 70th birthday of Mr. Othmar Rohn, CMBHI, of Rooks Wood, Windsor Road, Gerrards

Othmar Rohn came to this country in 1929 to join the Roamer Watch Co. and Medana Watches Ltd. He meant to stay for a year, but liked it, and he is still here! He had always been fond of languages. Having been born at Subingen, Solothurn, in 1906, he later went to Fribourg to study languages as well as commercial subjects. At 18 he joined Roamer's. But he continued studying, getting the diploma of the Swiss Mercantile Society in conjunction with the Watchmakers' School of Solothurn. We reproduce a few lines from the "Goldsmiths' Journal" of April 1956, when Mr Rohn became Chairman of the British Jewellers' Association in London, the first non-British national to hold this office, having held various other offices in the Trade. "Mr Rohn", the article said, "is a man who does not trust to luck. He thinks out his course and skillfully navigates through the shallows of restrictions and the reefs of supply and demand, using the variable trade winds to his best advantage".

He became Alternate Director of his company in 1934 and Managing

Director in 1944. He retired, only to take on another task, and today he is Consultant for the United Kingdom to the Fédération Horlogère Suisse in Bienne.

In 1937 he got married, and he and his wife Joan are well known in the Swiss community. He has many hobbies, amongst them photography and boating. He is a member of the Oxford House Rowing Club, now an Hon. Vice-President, since he had to give up active participation in competitive rowing.

We wish him many an enjoyable birthday and many happy returns of it.


