— New provisions concerning the status of children and Swiss nationality	11	<b>Citizenship of children of Swiss mothers and foreign fathers</b> According to today's law, citizenship is treated unequally. The present ruling is looked upon as discrimination by Swiss women abroad. This applies to the treatment of children of Swiss fathers and originally foreign mothers, as well as of children of Swiss mothers and foreign fathers, who had the privilege of their parents being resident in Switzerland at the time of their birth.
— Federal Ballots	11	A group of experts was appointed by the Commission of the Swiss Abroad. Their findings, based on legal advice, clearly show that a change in the Constitution is necessary in order to reach the desired aim.
— Notice Zaire	12	The Commission of the Swiss Abroad considers it its duty to look after the rights of the Swiss abroad, at the same time putting its trust in the sense of justice of the Swiss authorities and the Swiss people.

### Draft of a new Federal Constitution

The Commission of the Swiss Abroad, at its meeting of 25th August 1978  
at Einsiedeln, and after taking note of the draft of a new Federal  
Constitution as prepared by a group of experts, has realised with conster-  
nation that the Swiss abroad are mentioned only once in a single Article,  
58, Par. 1, and that only in connection with the use of their voting rights.  
This implies that the acknowledged rights of the Swiss abroad as  
guaranteed in the Constitution will be curtailed in the new Constitution.  
The Commission of the Swiss Abroad states emphatically that the Swiss  
abroad can only accept a new Constitution which does not include any  
worsening of their position, and that the guarantees should be expressly  
mentioned in the Constitution.

The Commission of the Swiss Abroad, after consulting all Swiss  
organisations abroad, will submit their demands to the authorities in a  
separate declaration.

The result of this consultation of the Swiss abroad will be the main theme  
of the 57th Assembly of the Swiss Abroad at the end of August 1979. It  
will then be introduced to the Swiss public.
