### J. W. BONJOUR 80

It is with great pleasure that we announce the 80th birthday on 23rd February of Mr. W. J. Bonjour, of 72 Shirley Avenue, Croydon, Surrey.

He was born at Blonays/Vevey where he attended a private school from the age of 5. When he was 10, he went to the Collège Scientifique at

Vevey for six years. After that, he spent four years at the commercial section of the *Obere Realschule* in Basle.

After a two years' apprenticeship at a bank, combined with evening classes in commerce, commercial law and languages, Mr. Bonjour went to Orbe where he worked at the offices of Nestlé. On 1st April, 1920, he joined the staff of the Swiss Bank Corporation in London where he worked for six years in the Foreign Correspondence Department. In 1926, he was transferred to the Payments Department where he was second in charge. Mr. Bonjour was promoted to "fondé de pouvoirs" in charge of that department until he retired early in 1964.

In June 1924, he married Miss Louise Collet of Breteuil/Montreux. They celebrated their Golden Wedding on 10th June, 1974.

Mr. Bonjour was a member of the Swiss Club for a short time, and the City Swiss Club for 20 years. He is still a member of the Swiss Philatelic Society and the Swiss Mercantile Society, as well as a Council member of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

Since his retirement, his main hobby has been looking after the garden.

Nobody will believe that J. W. Bonjour has reached the rank of the octogenarians. All his friends hope that his good health and energy will continue and that he will not only enjoy a happy birthday, but many equally happy returns of it. MM

## NEW DEPUTY PRESIDENT FOR SWISSAIR

Swissair's Board of Directors has elected Mr. Hans Schneider, executive vice-president finance and associated companies, as the airline's new full-time deputy president from 1st August. He succeeds Dr. Heinz Haas, at present deputy president and secretary-general, who retires on 31st July on reaching the age limit.

Mr. Schneider has been with Swissair since 1939 and joined the airline's Management in 1964 as head of the finance department. Dr. Haas became in 1948 Swissair's first general manager for Western Switzerland in Geneva and a member of the Management as secretary-general at the Zürich head office in 1951. He was in addition appointed deputy president in 1972. In view of Dr. Haas' retirement, the functions of the general secretariat have been delegated to other departments.

As from 1st August, Swissair's top management consists of the president, his deputy, three executive vice-presidents heading department groups and thirteen vice-presidents in charge of departments and central services.

## ERICA PEDRETTI IN PROFILE

The writer ERICA PEDRETTI was born in Sternberg, Northern Moravia, in 1930. She grew up in Zabreh, but spent part of her youth also in her native town and in Berlin and Freudenthal. In 1945 a Red Cross convoy brought her to Switzerland. From 1946 to 1950 she attended the Zürich College of Art. She then emigrated to the United States, and worked for two years as a gold and silversmith in New York. In 1952 she married the Swiss painter and sculptor Gian Pedretti. They lived and worked in Celerina until 1974, when they moved to La Neuveville. They have five children.
