

1978 in Retrospect




Avalanches disrupted traffic in Switzerland; on the Loetschberg line, an avalanche caused a terrible accident.



The Federal Councillors united with responsible personalities of the Federal Chancellery. Do you recognize them? (See page 11)




The two German terrorists Gabriele Kroecher and Christian Moeller were sentenced to several years of imprisonment by a Court at Porrentruy.

Deluge-like rainfall on the Southern slopes of the Alps caused considerable damage.




The Canton of Jura was recognized by the Confederation. Gathering in the capital Delémont.

At Lake Placid, Erich Schaefer and Josef Benz became world champions in two-man bobsleigh racing.




The first strike by journalists in Switzerland. The periodical «Tat» published by Migros was suspended because of differences of opinion.

Book reviews

«La Description de la Principauté de Neuchâtel et de Valangin» (Description of the Principality of N. and of V.)

The manuscript was written in 1692 and has now been re-published. Abraham Amiest, doctor and mathematician, describes the customs and problems of the population of the Canton during that epoch. The text is in Old French, a reproduction of the original work. The format is 16.5 x 24 cm and the price is SFr 9.—. Publisher: Revue neuchâteloise, case postale 906, 2001 Neuchâtel, Switzerland.

«L'ambulance du Docteur Alexis Carrel 1914-1919»

In the years 1914 to 1918, the term «ambulance» meant all movable field hospitals which tried to alleviate at least the worst suffering during those tragic times. Dr. Carrel asked a group of nurses of the nursing school «La Source» in Lausanne to help him in looking after the injured. This school which owned a collection of hitherto unpublished documentation regarding the «ambulance», committed itself to the promotion of this expedient. It entrusted one of their collaborators, Georgette Mottier, with this task. The text is in French. There are 180 pages and 76 photographs. Distribution: Payot Lausanne or ASS
