EDUCATION IN SWITZERLAND

Languages without tears

EVERY summer young guests from all parts of the world come to Switzerland to improve their knowledge of foreign languages.

Depending on the choice of school, they stay either in beautiful cities, amid the enchanting mountains or in lakeside towns and villages. All these visitors have a common purpose - to further their education in a most friendly and invigorating atmosphere and at the same time to take advantage of the numerous opportunities for active sports and relaxing hobbies that Switzerland offers.

The country has a long tradition of expertise in the organisation of boarding schools and other educational institutions. The various courses are described in the brochure "Holidays and Language Courses in Switzerland 1981," recently published by the Swiss National Tourist Office.

Both traditional and modern methods of teaching are applied, including the use of

language laboratories. After a few audio-visual lessons, students soon discover that learning languages can be fun.

The lessons are usually for two or three hours in the morning, leaving the afternoon free for sports such as swimming, sailing, water skiing, riding and tennis. At weekends the students can go on walking tours, mountain climbing and camping or visiting cultural interests in the area.

Social time is often spent with the students from different countries, getting together in groups for discussions, to play music and, in fact, to have a jolly good time together.
