Pleasure in processions

PROCESSIONS are among the most ardent and sincere aspects of life among the people of the southernmost Swiss canton, the Ticino. And never more so than at Easter time.

Yet the southern character of the Ticinesi means that even the most solemn Passion scenes, as presented in such places as Locarno, Bignasco, Ronco or Mendrisio, not only fill spectators with reverence for the meaning of what is being enacted, but also with innocent

pleasure at the beauty and colour of the procession itself.

The two well-known Mendrisio processions, on the evenings of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, are basically different in character.

Dramatic

The first day may be regarded as an example of the most primitive dramatic art. Christ's journey to Calvary is re-enacted in exaggerated fashion and the procession, with its baroque

Bread to fend off harm

A LOAF of bread, symbol of friendship and prosperity, changes hands. A farmer, whose hard work helped to produce it, hands it over to a young man of the village — an Easter Monday tradition in many parts of the Valais.

At Ferden in the Loetschental, they not only distribute bread but also wine and goatmilk cheese. This is honouring a bequest that goes back to the Middle Ages, and was originally endowed to avert any possible harm from the three alps that tower above the village.

undertones, includes the various characters of the Passion story, some of them in glittering attire and trappings, others in modest simple dress.

The second procession, however, is strongly liturgical. The moving play-acting of the previous day gives way to a dignified procession of the clergy. Luminous banners which hang across the streets or are carried along in the procession give it additional character.

Switzerland by Europabus

"EUROPABUS", the motor coach system of the European railways, is organising escorted motor coach tours in Switzerland with departures from Zurich and Geneva.

The tours last between two and a half and six days. Prices start from Sfr. 350, including half board.
