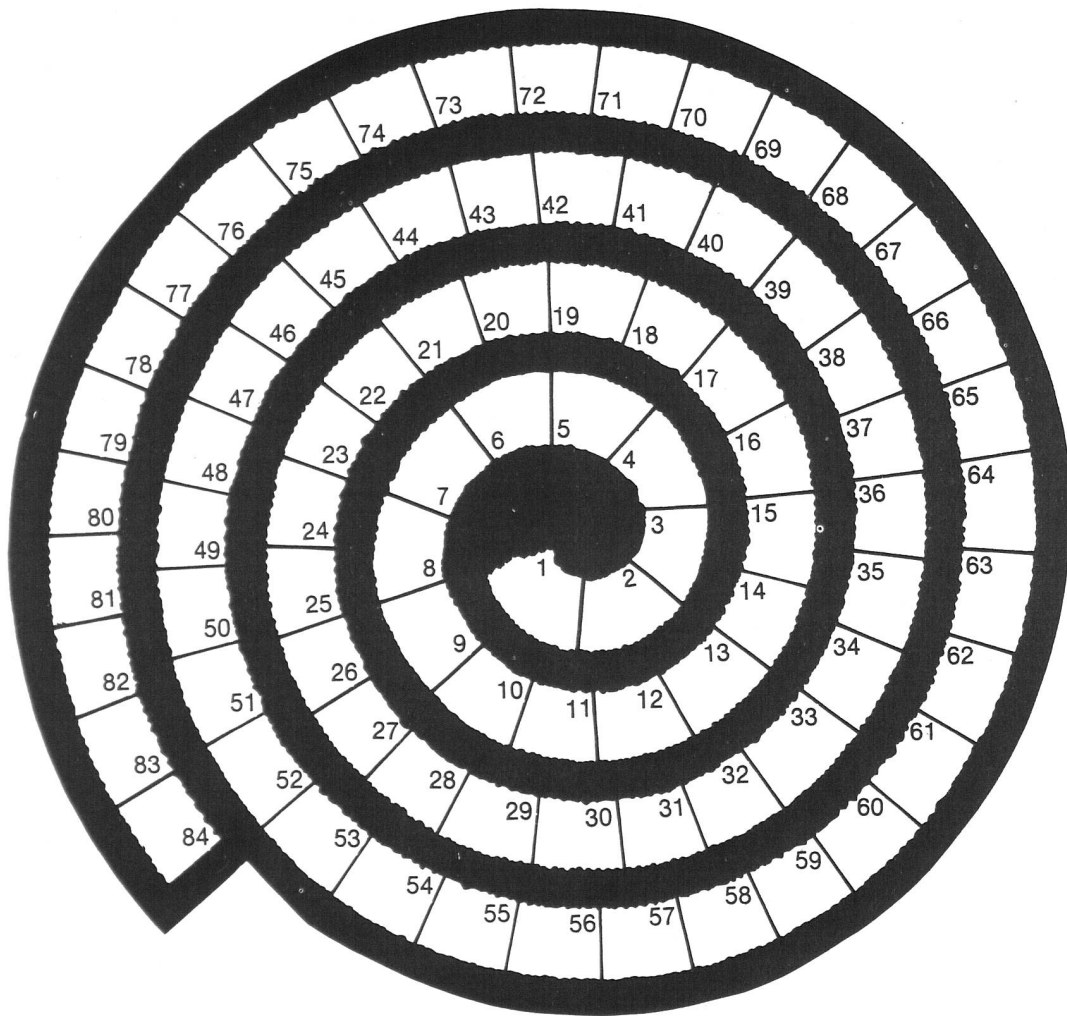

ANSWERS to the clues should be entered with the first letter in the numbered space indicated by the clue number and then proceeding outwards.

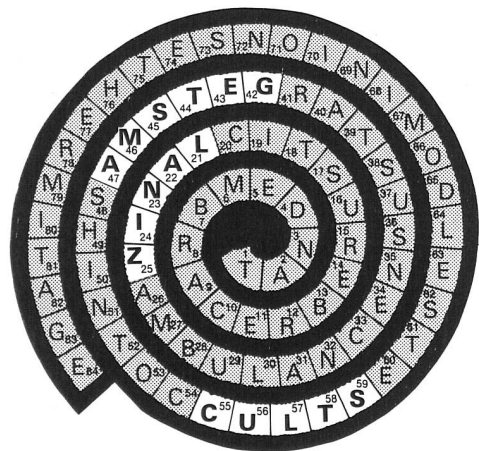
Words overlap by one or more letters so that the

The three towns hidden in the reverse reading of the last puzzle were Zinal, from 25 back to 21, Amsteg, 47 back to 42, St Luc, 59 back to 55.
