Walser's words

THIS month sees the publication of a book of selected stories by Robert Walser, who was born in Biel in central Switzerland and has been described as the greatest German-language writer since Kafka.

The book, simply entitled "Selected Stories", is the first extended collection of Walser's work to appear in English. It has been translated by, among others, the distinguished translator Christopher Middleton who has been associated with Walser's

work for nearly 20 years.

After his first poems and prose pieces, which appeared at the turn of the century, Walser wrote eight novels, over 1,000 short prose pieces and a great many poems.

Sadly, in 1929, after a period of severe mental distress, his doctors diagnosed schizophrenia. He entered a mental hospital in 1933 and never wrote again.

He died, during a lonely walk in the snow, on Christmas Day, 1956.
