A native of Fife, George was brought up in Methil and educated locally. He later attended Edinburgh University, the London School of Economics and London University, where he gained a BSc in Economics in 1963.

He worked for several English government authorities in the field of mental health and in 1969, after a five-year spell as senior lecturer at Sheffield Polytechnic, returned to Fife to become Dunfermline's director of social work.

In his latter years, George made an immense contribution to social work training programmes throughout the East of Scotland.

George was the husband of

our club's secretary and he will be sadly missed by all the members of the Dunfermline Swiss Club.

For years, he and his wife Friedgard have offered us their home for our monthly meetings.

George never failed to show interest in our activities and was always ready to lend a helping

hand when and where it was needed.
