He preached his last sermon on September 18 at a combined German/French service to a well represented congregation. It was during his time that the French and German speaking parishes became united under one minister, a move that was made imperative by the impossibility to find a new French-speaking minister for the small comgregation and the everlasting shortage of funds under which the church is constantly labouring.

After some anxious times, we have been able, with the help of the Federation of Swiss Churches in Berne, to find a replacement, and on October 16 the installation of the new minister, the Rev Hans Wunderli from St Gall took place at the Swiss Church in the presence of a very large congregation.

The new minister and his wife are now settling down in the manse at 1 Womersley Road, London N8, and are looking forward to meeting all the members of the French and German speaking communities in due

During the 1984/85 season,

Matthias Bamert will be back for two or three series of concerts. He was born in Ersingen (Canton Berne) in 1942. He studied the oboe, chamber music, conducting and composition in Berne and Paris, and in Darmstadt with Pierre Boulez.

From 1965 to 1969 he was principal oboist of the Mozarteum Orchestra in Salzburg. He worked with the Cleveland Orchestra with George Szell in 1960-1970 and until 1978 was resident conductor of that orchestra under Lorin Maazel.

As guest conductor he has appeared with many major European and American orchestras, including the Zurich Tonhalle, the Munich Philharmonic, the Detroit Symphony, Berlin Radio Orchestra and the West German Radio Orchestra. He has taken part in a large number of international music festivals.

In 1977 he was appointed Music Director of the Swiss Radio Orchestra, Basle, and is now its principal guest conductor.

Well known as an oboist and conductor, Mr Bamert also has the reputation of being a highly innovative composer. He was awarded the George Szell Memorial Award in 1970 and the Cleveland Arts Prize in 1974. Mr Bamert has recently given several concerts in Great Britain with the Scottish National and Chamber orchestras and the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra.

He has taken part in the Wexford Festival and the Aberdeen International Youth Festival. His conducting has been widely acclaimed by the British press.

Tamas Vasary will be the piano soloist with Walter Weller, conductor, and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra on *Dec 12 (Mon)* 7.30pm at the Royal Festival Hall. Programme; Mozart - Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, Dvorak - Symphony No 8. (Booking opens November 12).
