#### SWISS MERCANTILE SOCIETY ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING. (At Swiss House, February 26th, 1930.)

The Annual General Meeting always attracts many Members and a gathering of nearly seventy was present when Mr. Paschoud, President of the Swiss Mercantile Society, declared the Meeting open. He read out the Annual Report summaris-ing the activities of the various branches of the S.M.S. during the past year. In conclusion he read out a letter received from Federal Conncillor Motta, expressing his thanks for the nice recep-tion accorded him at Swiss House when he visited the school and affirming his willingness for help, should ever the Society require it. The reports bearing on the Education De-The Annual General Meeting always attracts

should ever the Society require it. The reports bearing on the Education De-partment, Evening Classes and House-Committee were read out and agreed to with applause. The various accounts of the Society which had been passed by the Anditors were approved and a vote of thanks was passed to the Treasurers and Audi-tors for their untiring efforts. Referring to the forthcoming General Meeting of Members and Delegates of the Swiss Mercantile Society in Zurich on May 10th and 11th. Mr. Paschoud ex-pressed his hopes that our Society would be strongly represented as the business to be dealt with will be of the utmost importance. This will be a great gathering of all Members in Switzera great gathering of all Members in Switzerland and abroad.

Scrutineers were elected and the election took Scrittmeers were elected and the election took place. The outgoing Committees were thanked for their past services. Mr. P. F. Böhringer was elected temporary chairman and once more proved his qualifications for this office. It was impossible to re-appoint the Committees en bloc as various Officers did not seek re-election.

Officers did not seek re-election. Mr. Paschoud, who has held the dual position of President of the Society and Chairman of the Education Committee, felt that the work entailed was too much for one man. He did an enormous amount of work during the past year and safely guided the ship S.M.S. round the dangerous cliffs. The Meeting heartily applauded a vote of thanks for his invaluable services and expressed its delight at his willingness to carry on the Presidency of the S.M.S. Mr. W. Deutsch, who was elected a member of the Education Committee last October, was elected as Chairman of that Committee. Committee.

Committee. The Meeting was unable to fill the offices of the Chairman and Secretary of the House-Commit-tee. Thanks are due to Messrs. G. Jenne and J. J. Boos for their unselfish and untiring work they rendered on that Committee which involved a heavy task especially during the past year on ac-count of the building alterations at Swiss House. The Acting-Secretaryhip of the Society (paid) had also to be left in abeyance, this office being combined with the Secretaryship of the School which is at present vacant. It will be the first important task of the newly elected Committee to appoint a Secretary to the Society. It was also suggested that the Secretaryship of the House-Committee should be combined with that of the Acting-Secretary. Acting Secretary.

The President reported that the Education Committee had been obliged to expel one of the students who had created a lot of trouble in the school and submitted a proposal by the out-going joint Committees that he should be expelled also from the Society as he was a member of the Lon-don Section. The Meeting after a short dis-cussion unanimously adopted the proposal and the student in question was requested to leave the premises as he was no longer a member. Whilst the scrutineers were busy counting the votes, our Hon. Member and late President, Mr. A. C. Stahelin, gave a report on the work of the Select Committee which was brought into existence at the preceding Annual General Meeting for the purpose of study-ing the advisability of transforming the Society into a registered Company. Mr. Stahelin, Chairman of that Committee, was pleased to in-form the Members that the work is progressing and that Registration might be possible within a few months. Advice had been given with regard to Income Tax, which is the most important factor. Apart from that under the present sys-tem the Society has no legal standing whatsoever, to Income TaX, which is the most important factor. oos and seconded by Mr. Paschond was carried : "It is resolved that this Annual General Meeting after having heard Mr. Stahelin's re-port on the progress made by the Select Com-mittee appointed at the last Annual General Meeting to study the advisability of the form-ation and registration of the Society as a registered Company re-affirms the present mem-bers of the said Committee and begs of them to carry on their work with a view to submitting a report to a special General Meeting of the a report to a special General Meeting of the Society at the earliest possible moment."

It was also agreed that any professional and legal expenditure incurred by the said Committee

for purposes of its deliberations be paid for by the Education Department.

Mr. Stahelin pointed out that the credit of £20 granted by the last Annual General Meeting was by no means sufficient to cover the cost for legal advice and registration and that these are more likely to be £200.


