4th INTERNATIONAL AVIATION MEETING ZURICH

23rd July to August 1st, 1937

Of the eight competitions which will be carried through at the 4th International Aviation Meeting Zurich, the climbing and diving competition, the altitude competition and the race over a circuit will be pronounced contests of mechanical efficiency in which the aeroplanes themselves, and especially their engine power, will be the decisive factor.

In the climbing and diving contest a climb up to 3,000 m. above sea-level with subsequent diving must be carried out, and only extremely efficient and strongly built planes are able to stand such a strain. The altitude competition stipulates a flight to a height of 10,000 m. above sea level for single seaters, and 9,000 m. for two-seaters. In this competition success depends to a greater extent on the engine than on the type of aeroplanes used. For flights at this high altitude it is evident that only special engines fitted with superchargers can be used with any chance of success. The speed contest will be carried out on the circular stretch Aerodrome Dübendorf Wil (Dübendorf) church tower—Grünigen church tower—the Bachtel tower—Wangen church tower. Each competitor must cover this circuit of 50.5 kilometers four times. A great part of the circular route will be visible from the aerodrome at Dübendorf, so that this competition will be particularly interesting for the spectators.

These three contests, however, constitute a severe test not only of the planes but also of the pilots owing both to the rapid changes of air pressure when diving and the great cold and rarity of the air encountered during flights at high altitudes. The speed flights, too, require a great deal of concentration and training in curve-flying on the part of the pilot.

For the climbing and diving contest 13 entries have been registered from the following countries: Belgium (2), Czechoslovakia (3), England (1), France (2), Germany (3), and Switzerland (2), whilst the altitude competition will see five competitors at the starts one each from France and Italy and three from Switzerland. The Italian colours will be defended by the well-known Lieut.-Col. Pezzi who set up a world record for altitude on May 7 of this year. France will be represented by the well-known Capt. Michy. In the speed contest England, France, and Germany will each be represented by one competitor, the last named country by its ace, Major-General Udet.
