NOTES AND GLEANINGS.

Coming down to more mundane matters now, a writer in the "Christian Science Monitor" of 12th July is surprised:

Fancy, Keeping Cheese as an Heirloom:

Most of us would be rather startled if, when we called on a friend in the country, he were to show us among other treasured heirlooms an ancient cheese! Yet this is an experience that might actually occur in the Swiss Canton of the Valais, where cheeses are frequently preserved in memory of some important family event.

Some years ago at an exhibition of cheese in that Canton there were quite a number of such "museum pieces" on view. The patriarch, weighing 14 pounds, had been "born" 150 years before! This precious relic was finally handed over by the family that owned it to the safe keeping of a large dairy organization.

But the Swiss, as a general rule, eat their cheese, and in large quantities, too; although they certainly have a fancy for letting it first attain years of discretion. Some of the "alp" cheese is kept four to six years before being offered for sale, and buyers are then advised to lay it by for another 10 to 15 years.

Alpine Alchemilla for flavour.

There are in Switzerland quite a number of interesting cheeses apart from the common ones like Gruyère, which, incidentally, is said to owe its excellent flavour principally to a plant called Alpine Alchemilla that grows abundantly in those parts.

You can get cream cheeses, semi-cream cheeses, whey cheeses, curd cheeses, yohurt cheeses, combinations of cheese and butter. There are also sweet cheeses, cheeses flavoured with alpine herbs and with garlic, with caraway seeds, with fruit and with ham.

Quite typical of Switzerland is the soft herb cheese called Schabzieger, which can be spread on your bread. It is sold in little pyramid shapes and is a decided green owing to the herb called "Ziegerklee" or "wey clover" which is mixed with it. Schabzieger is made, and has been made for centuries, almost exclusively in the Canton of Glarus. It has a very special flavour which you either like very much or not at all. Its smell, too, is so aggressive that one whiff may put you off forever from tasting the cheese!

Known to Thackeray.

Schabzieger must have been known to Thackeray, for he has in "Vanity Fair" a character called Baron Shapsugar. He is one of the guests at a reception given by Becky Sharp, the other guests also bearing the names of well-known Swiss cheeses.

The above reminds me of a family in the old-village of Tolleshunt d'Arcy in Essex — there are plenty of beautiful and entirely unspoilt villages in our part of the world, if you know *Where* to look for them! — who keep a *Ham* as an heirloom and have kept it for about 100 years already, so that it would appear that hams, or cheeses may form objects of family pride and veneration.
