# REPORT ON INTERIM GENERAL MEETING OF THE UNIONE TICINESE,

held on the 19th December, 1943, at the Swiss Club, 74, Charlotte Street, W.1.

The President, Mr. C. Ferrari, called the meeting to order and the minutes of the last General Meeting held in January, 1943, were read by the Vice-Secretary, Mr. E. Genini, and passed unanimously.

The report on the Festa Famigliare held at the Dorchester Hotel, on 31st October, 1943, was then given and a vote of thanks accorded to the Entertainment Committee for the success achieved.

The next item on the agenda was the appointment of three auditors to inspect the Society's accounts for 1943, Messrs. A. Notari, G. Giuliani and I. Bassi, being elected to perform this important function.

Three new members were admitted to the ranks of the Society and pleasure was expressed at this occurrence.

The Secretary, Mr. P. DeMaria made a statement on the progress of the Ladies Section of the Society which was received with warm approval. Thanks and gratitude.were extended to the ladies for their devoted and untiring efforts.

The President asked for any further suggestions and Mr. C. Berti, seconded by Mr. O. Gambazzi, proposed that the matter of admitting the ladies to participation in the Mutual Aid Fund open to all male members should be studied. After a lively discussion, a resolution, with one against, was passed that an opportunity should be given to all members to ventilate their ideas at the next General Meeting, consequent on which a decision should be taken to empower the Committee, or otherwise, to investigate this matter and present its proposals.

The proceedings were wound up by the President, who thanked all present for their co-operation.

The Christmas Draw held in aid of the Swiss Benevolent Fund followed and a substantial success was announced. The numbers of winning tickets in order of priority are appended for the information of all interested.
