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SOPHIE WYSS AT THE EDINBURGH FESTIVAL.

Sophie Wyss, the well-known Swiss soprano, sang at the Edinburgh Festival with great success. The *Glasgow Herald* wrote:

"Sophie Wyss's recital, given on Saturday evening in the Freemason's Hall, was not only of great interest to students of songs for it covered examples ranging from the troubadours to Ravel, but it captured the fancy of her audience to such an extent that at the end of the concert they were joining enthusiastically in the refrain of a French folk song." *The Scotsman*, reported:

Sophie Wyss's programme on Saturday night was just what was needed after a week devoted to the Concertgebouw orchestra and the Hamburg State Opera. The folk songs were very satisfying. After two charming French-Canadian folk songs and a Breton lullaby the recital ended with Benjamin Britten's "Quand j'étais chez mon père". Its success led to an *encore*; it was sung again with the audience taking up the refrain. As a Festival event it did everyone a world of good."
