AN INTERESTING LECTURE.

This is to draw the attention of any interested members of the Swiss Colony to a lecture, which has been arranged by the Swiss Mercantile Society, on the topical subject of "The work of the Council of Europe." The lecture will take place at Swiss House, at 7.30 p.m. on Wednesday November 12th and is open also to non-members of the S.M.S. and their friends.

The lecturer, Mr. Stanley H. C. Woolrych, O.B.E. is eminently qualified to talk about this subject, having been H.M. Consul and Information Officer at Strassbourg from the end of 1949 to April 1952. Before going to Strassbourg Mr. Woolrych was the Head of an Information Department of the Foreign Office from 1946 to 1949, in which capacity he was in frequent touch with the Correspondents of Swiss newspapers stationed in the U.K.

Mr. Woolrych is also known to be a very great friend of our country having travelled and photographed there extensively and knowing certain regions extremely well. In view of the increasingly important part the Council of Europe seems to be called upon to play, this lecture ought to prove particularly interesting.
