## CIGARETTE PRODUCTION IN SWITZERLAND

In 1965, Swiss cigarette production increased by about 21%, rising from 15,600 million cigarettes in 1964 to 19,000 million in 1965. Those in the trade attribute this exceptional rise partly to the prospect of increased taxes on tobacco, which led the public to lay in stocks. The proportion of Maryland cigarettes (dark tobacco) continues to fall off, although it still accounts for 41.6% of the total output. The popularity of cigarettes with an American flavour, on the other hand, is soaring: 40.6% of the output in 1965 as opposed to 34.1% in 1964, which represents an increase of 19%. In 1965, filter-tip cigarettes represented 85.3% of the output (1964: 83.8%).

## MODERN HUNTER ON SKIS IN THE VALAIS

Old Finnish and Lapland legends tell of the remarkable feats of endurance accomplished by ski-borne hunters whose duty it was to protect the reindeer herds against wolves, bear and other bloodthirsty beasts of prey. On their very primitive snowshoes, these olden-day herdsmen would pursue the murderous animals over incredible distances until they had caught them. A very different task has been assigned to game warden Konrad Hirschier in the region of Goms, the wild, often snowbound basin at the uppermost end of the Rhone Valley. The Cantonal Forestry Office has charged him with the guarding and care of the frequently starving game in the area. Laden with sacks of dry fodder often weighing 100 pounds or more, he follows the tracks of the hungry animals until he finds them and feeds them. In the course of his remarkably strenuous work, the tough Goms man developed into Switzerland's finest long-distance skier and during the past two winters walked off with no less than five championships. His recent success at the Nordic World Ski Championships held in Oslo last February was fit recompence for his long, hard efforts.
