THE ENGLISH-SPEAKING WORLD AT THE GENEVA MOTOR SHOW

Great Britain, the United States and Canada usually make up an important delegation to the International Motor Show in Geneva. Again this year they constitute an important group as, from 14th to 24th March, the Geneva Motor Show welcomes no fewer than 279 Anglo-Saxon exhibitors.

The national break-down is as follows:

Canada: 5, all makers of accessories and spare parts.

Great Britain: 130, including 20 automobile manufacturers, 9 of heavy vehicles and contractors' machinery, and 94 makers of accessories and spare parts.

U.S.A.: 144, including 8 automobile manufacturers, 6 of heavy vehicles and contractors' machinery, and 130 makers of accessories and spare parts.

To this list should be added one of the most distant exhibiting nations, Australia, with four accessory and motor manufacturers represented, giving one a full idea of the great participation by the English-speaking countries. Their numerous presence is an important contribution to the Show, where tens of thousands of visitors from all over Switzerland and Europe are at present attending this important show.

OUTER SPACE COMES TO THE 38th GENEVA MOTOR SHOW

The world of outer space and means of its conquest were already in evidence last year at the Geneva Motor Show with the display of a small scale model of the "Gemini" capsule.

This year a full scale mock-up of the Gemini space ship is on display at the Motor Show, from 14th to 24th March. This is the capsule which made possible most of the United States' exploits in space, notably various space rendez-vous and space-walks by American astronauts. However, Gemini is not the sole exhibit. It is accompanied by a model of the orbital space-ship belonging to the "Apollo" programme. This apparatus, launched by the giant Saturn rocket, which is more than 100 metres high, is intended to orbit the moon. There is also a mock-up of the lunar module which will permit astronauts to explore our famous natural satellite.

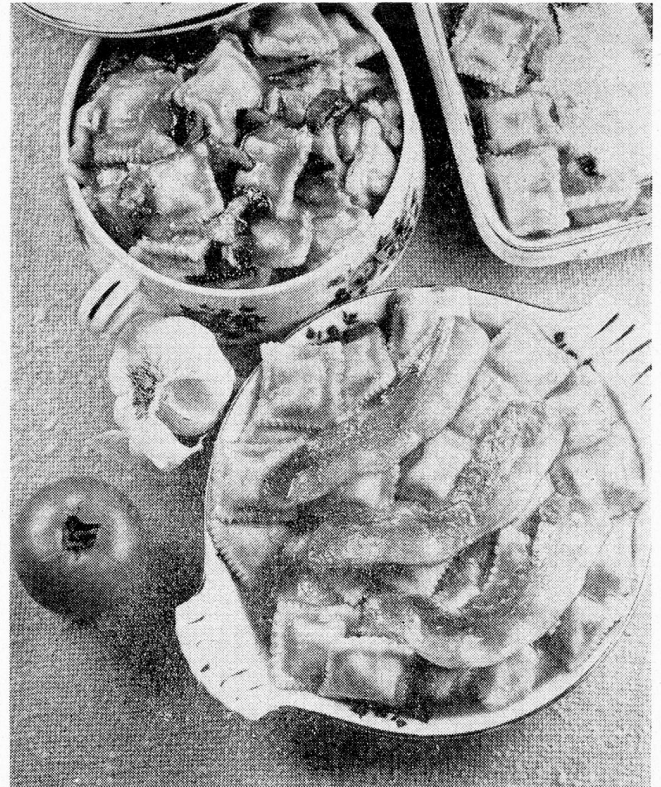
It is certain that casual spectators as well as the initiated will take great pleasure in becoming more familiar with these marvellous examples of man's inventive genius, and will be impressed by the increasingly important role they play in the evolution of scientific knowledge and discovery of outer-space.

However, the presence of spatial technology will not overshadow a parallel technique, a more earthly progress: that of the automobile industry which is represented with its sedans and touring cars, its trucks and special equipment, its heavy vehicles and its accessories.
