## Editor's Jottings

**Thanks to the fact** we now have a reasonable stock of varied articles in hand it is possible to present a reasonably balanced magazine each quarter, but this happy state of affairs does in no small measure depend on our receiving a steady supply of fresh material. In general there is no need to ask if we want an article, the only exceptions are if we have just published something on the same subject, or where a fairly long feature is contemplated when it makes good sense to check when we can fit it into the schedule. There are however a couple of points that should be observed.

## COMPETITION

**LOKI**, the Swiss railway and model magazine, has announced a competition expressly for members of the Swiss Railways Society with up to £1000 in prizes. It is for layouts, modules or dioramas which must incorporate at least one turnout, and be of a standard gauge prototype, HO, N or Z gauge, of a Swiss prototype or recognisably Swiss. The entry may be of an existing model, or one purpose built for the competition by must not have been previously published, or accepted for publication elsewhere.

### Rules

1. A short description of your entry, together with a drawing of the track layout, buildings, scenery etc., which need not be to scale, must reach LOKI by **31 January 1993** at the latest.
2. If the entry is accepted, you may not publish it anywhere else. Entries which are judged not to be suitable for publication in LOKI will be released from this ban by **31st July 1993** at the latest.
3. The entry must be finished, in the sense that photographs suitable for publication may be taken by the LOKI-Team by **1st June 1993**. It will not matter if the wiring etc. is not finished.
4. It is expected that entrants will keep LOKI informed of progress from time to time, with photographs. The construction methods are also of interest. (This is for new construction, for existing layouts please write a short note on how you achieved the result.)
5. All prizes (Rolling stock, videos, books, railwayana etc.) will be awarded by **31 July 1993** at the latest.
