Editor's Jottings

We have had a number of members mention the absence of modelling articles in our pages. As has been pointed out in virtually every issue in this volume, members are not submitting them. One of the basic rules of magazine publication; particularly in amateur journals; is that you can't publish what you don't get. It can hardly have escaped member's notice that John Jesson, who in the past provided many modelling features, has been very busy with the universally popular signal series, whilst for my part Swiss Express takes priority over my own modelling projects.

I would however stress the fact that we are an amateur magazine. We work on a shoestring budget, we come out four times a year and are A5 as opposed to the A4 format used by commercial journals. Even if I wanted to try, it is frankly impossible to compete with *Continental Modeller* and, at the risk of offending some members, I would suggest that anyone with a major, well illustrated modelling feature would serve the Society best by making reference to the SRS in the text and submitting it to *CM*, thereby bringing both Swiss modelling and the Society to the attention of the unenlightened.

Still on the modelling theme, how many of you have entered the LOKI competition announced on page 5 of the September 1992 issue? This has been staged especially for our benefit and whilst I regret it is for standard gauge projects only (ruling me out for a start), it is a worthwhile venture and deserves member's fullest support. Time is running short, you need to get your proposals to LOKI by 31st January and with Christmas and New Year to distract you, DO IT NOW. Please note that existing HO, N or Z gauge projects not previously published are eligible, many members should have a head start. Don't leave it to the other chap, he's relying on you.

It is hoped to show some of the diorama entries at the AGM, details of which will be seen in the 'advertisement' on page 18 of this issue.
