FUTURE EVENT

SRS/West Somerset Railway Weekend 30/31st August & 1st September 1996

Mention was made in the September magazine of the above and Roy Duglison has now made the following arrangements. Due to restricted space I am unable to print the full itinerary with times etc. but I hope the outlined events will encourage you to join in.

Roy has negotiated a rate of £20.00 per person per night for B&B with the Wellington Hotel, Minehead (to include en-suite facilities). On the Friday evening Roy will give a slide show at a local hall on the "SBB/BLS to W.J.R.". On Saturday there will be a Mini Model Railway Exhibition with Swiss, American and British layouts plus videos and one or two trade stands. In the evening a cold buffet will be provided in the Northfield Hotel after which Mark Smith the Managing Director of W.J.R. will give a short talk on the Railway.

Sunday will include visits to the W.J.R. workshops/signal box at Minehead and the visitors centre in Bishops Lydeard. The party will leave Minehead on the 10.15am (steam hauled) returning by the 12.20pm in the "Quantock Belle Stock", during which a 3 course lunch will be served. The party will be treated to a "Cream Tea" in the stock at Minehead Station and those who have travelled to Somerset by train can

depart for Bishops Lydeard on the 15.50pm for the coach transfer to Taunton Station. Those travelling by car can still have a further trip on the 15.50pm if they wish, returning on the 17.45pm. This is possible as one of the conditions of the weekend is that all members of the party purchase a WEEKEND W.J.R. Rover Ticket.

The cost for the Rover Ticket, the 3 course lunch on the train, the cream tea, the Saturday Evening buffet and help towards the cost of room hire for two venues, is £45.00 per person. Cheques should be made payable to the SRS and sent to Roy at Tancombe, Redgates Road, Minehead, Somerset, TA24 8DA. Hotel bookings for the Wellington Hotel, Wellington Square, Minehead, TA24 5NH, should be made direct, for "the attention of Mrs Rundle" and mention the SRS.

If you stay at the Wellington Hotel for the two nights the total cost per person is only £95.00 (you will need to organise your own meal on Friday night and Saturday lunch) for a very full weekend. Of course your Rover Ticket covers you for as many journeys as you like.

Many thanks to Roy for all his hard work in making the arrangements, and we look forward to seeing you at the first SRS Weekend?
