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Roco's HO Swiss specials

There is a current trend amongst model manufacturers (bus and train) to produce limited runs of items. This presumably boosts sales and adds rarity value to certain items. Often the only difference between one batch and the next is a running number, but livery changes and detail or design differences may also feature.

Roco is probably the most prolific manufacturer of Swiss Federal Railways (SBB) rolling stock, although Lima, Hag and others are also significant contributors. For this survey only the HO scale products of Roco built for DC (gleichstrom) operation are considered. I have to admit to being a collector of model railway rolling stock rather than an operator of a model railway layout - but hopefully, in time, this situation will be reversed! Visits to Swiss model railway shops, reading the Swiss model railway press and acquiring Roco catalogues of various sorts has revealed that an extensive range of models are, or have been, available as limited edition or "special" models. In recent years Roco has produced Swiss (and Austrian) supplements to the main catalogue which lists some of these items. However, many

other items are produced which do not reach these lists. I have tried to build up a list (and a collection) of these Swiss special items. By featuring this in Swiss Express other modellers may find the information of value and hopefully may be able to contribute further details from their own experience.

Before listing items it is worth noting that Roco invariably changes the running number of any item of rolling stock or locomotive when a new batch is produced. Catalogues will normally quote the locomotive numbers but for wagons and coaches this is not so obvious. e.g. The "Schweizer Zucker" silo wagon (46393) has recently been re-released with a new running number. The Eurocity coaches (46770/46771) have each been produced with at least three or four different running numbers.

A list of known locomotive issues is shown below. (Passenger and freight rolling stock may follow).
