

Turn on and Tune in to Swiss News

For those of you lucky enough to have a 'short wave' button on your radio it is possible to pick-up the broadcasts of Swiss Radio International in the UK at various times of the day with full reports at 12.00, 14.00 and 19.00 hours. Principally these can be picked up on short-wave frequencies 6.165MHz, 9.535MHz and 9.905MHz as well as on the Astra satellite.

For a full programme schedule you can write to Swiss Radio International, Giacomellistrasse 1, 3000 Bern 15, Switzerland.

Be aware though that short-wave transmissions are not as good as the FM stereo we are used to, signals fade and change with different weather conditions, but a good aerial can help.

An alternative to this may be to use the "Latest news in English" the phone numberr which in Switzerland is 157 300 30.
