THOUGHTS FROM THE CHAIR - Paul Russenberger

Welcome to the first *Swiss Express* with colour in each issue.

If you read the lists of the Officers at the front of *Swiss Express*, you may have noticed a change. At the Committee meeting in May, Roger Ellis was co-opted to the Committee in the role of Society Secretary. Additionally, although this probably only has a very marginal effect on the Membership and is rather more of an internal matter for the Committee, Geoff Thompson, who is formally an "ordinary member" of the Committee, is kindly acting as secretary to the Committee keeping the all-important record of the decisions taken. I am very grateful to both these gentlemen for kindly agreeing to take on these duties.
