Most members will be aware of the variety of passes available for travel on the Swiss Travel System and three new products are being introduced this year..

If two, three, four or five adults are travelling together the **Saver Program Swiss Pass** and equivalent **Flexi Pass** can save them 15%. A condition is that all the adults must travel together on all their journeys and (unlike the normal passes) there are no reductions for unaccompanied children.

This years **Swiss Pass** prices are:

and for **Swiss Flexi Passes** (overall validity 1 month) are:

This years **Swiss Card** (one days transfer from airport or border station to destination and return, plus unlimited tickets at half fare for up to 1 month) will cost £64 for 2nd class and £85 for 1st and the **Fly-Rail Baggage** service is £8.50 per piece each way.

The third new pass is the **Favourite Peaks of Switzerland**, allowing the holder to take three excursions to Schilthorn, Titlis, Klein Matterhorn, Brienzer Rothorn, Rochers de Naye, Corvatsch or Säntis. It can only be issued in conjunction with any other Swiss Travel Service pass and costs £52.
