Where is the incentive to travel by train? Answer there isn't any. The airlines are seamless, straightforward and cheap.

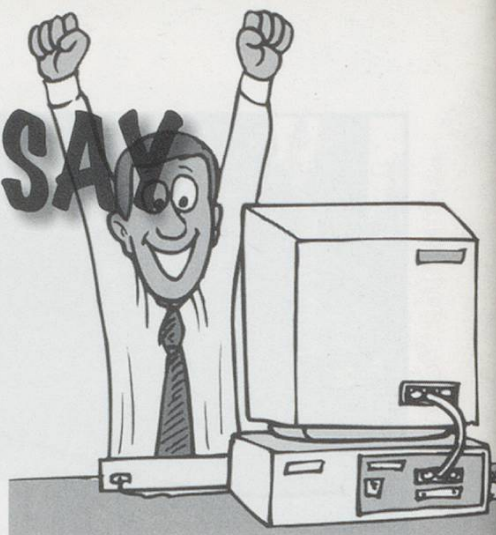
I suspect this is not what members generally want to hear but do you have an alternative, do you think I am wrong? I would be interested to hear from you.
