

This snow spreader is used on the RhB to assist in winter clearance work after a heavy snow fall. The vehicle has movable wings and is used to set the width of the path through the snow. It is pulled at the end of a works train to cut and funnel the snow to an area where it can be blown with the snow blower.

The steam driven rotary snow plough is another tool in the RhB's winter clearance fleet.
