# Switzerland Travel Centre - 2011 Discount Offer

The Swiss Railways Society has for many years been pleased to enjoy a good relationship with the Switzerland Travel Centre (STC) who have recently re-confirmed their membership of the SRS and their willingness to assist the Society and its members. Look out for more STC information in both *Swiss Express* and in other Swiss Railways Society publications.

As was announced at the AGM, in recognition of the 30-plus years that the SRS has been "flying-the-flag" for Switzerland, the STC will be offering SRS members 5% discount on their brochure packages (hotels/rail pass & hotels). Members purchasing Swiss Travel System rail passes will also benefit from the 5% discount. This offer applies to all bookings made before 31st December 2011. As well as booking train travel to Switzerland using Eurostar and SNCF via Paris, the STC now offers the alternative of travelling via Bruxelles and using daytime DB services through Germany. They can also get you to Switzerland overnight using the City Night Line service.

Diana Slavova at the STC is the point of contact for SRS members wishing to book by telephone on 020 7420 4908, or by email on **railtrade@stc.co.uk** The STC website is **www.stc.co.uk** if you wish to make on-line bookings. STC is also offering a personal appointment service at their Covent Garden office in London. Contact Diana, or one of her colleagues, and SRS members can call in to plan their Swiss trip over a cup of coffee or tea. In order to benefit from the 2011 discount scheme when contacting the STC, either in person or by phone, members must quote their SRS membership number. With on-line bookings the membership number must be entered in the appropriate "Promotional Codes and Notes" section of the booking in order for the discount to be calculated.

For the future the STC is keen to put together specialist packages for SRS members on a group or individual basis, and they invite members to contact them with ideas about things and events that they would be interested to have included in any potential trips.

### Energy.

### Enthusiasm.

• Time. At least 300 hours a year of which probably 200 are spent in December to February. Included in the figures are four Saturdays a year which you will need to devote to Committee meetings - including travelling time.

• Organisation. This is not a task for someone who prefers to put off to the week after next, something that can be done today.

• A methodical approach with the minimum of errors.

• Use of email, Microsoft Word and, especially, Microsoft Excel (including simple formulae) is essential. Knowledge of Microsoft Access (or a willingness to learn) would be an advantage in case the system is converted at a later date.

• Written & oral work. You will be in correspondence with members, potential members, fellow Committee members and some external organisations. You will not need to disclose your home telephone number widely if you do not wish to do so.

• **Maths.** Nothing too demanding but you will need to feel comfortable with basic calculations.

• **Fairly regular access** to a High Street Bank and a Post Office. This need not be the post holder if someone else is prepared to stand in queues on their behalf!

• **Patience.** Fortunately the vast majority of members present no problem whatsoever but inevitably there are some who manage to do the wrong thing in some way. These can require a disproportionate amount of time to resolve - and one or two can test the patience of a saint!
