

2. Member Chris Wisbey sent in a copy of this photograph that was purchased by his parents on their honeymoon, just before the outbreak of the Second World War. The caption on the picture states:- Thunersee, Beatenbuch mit Eiger, Monch und Jungfrau. He was intrigued by what appears to be a railway/tramway in the road along the side of the Thunersee. This was the Steffisburg-Thun-Interlaken (STI), originally a meter gauge line that reverted to trolley buses and closed in 1958.
