Major changes are not envisaged but the manner in which the magazine is managed and edited may need to be considered, as new people are welcomed into the roles that will be vacated, some of which are now quite time consuming. The Society already has received offers from members present at Derby, who have expressed an interest in taking on a role (or roles) and the Board would like to hear from others. New people with new ideas are what are needed if the Society and its magazine are to go forward. Expect no immediate changes, we three will remain at our computers for a while yet, however, if you think there may be a role for you with the magazine in two years time, please get in touch with either me or John Jesson the Chairman.
