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The symbol of Organdie

The fashion this season seems to call for nothing but the frothy billows of organdies and muslins and it is doubtless the sign of a break-away from austerity, a reaction against sport styles which demanded that, from morning to night, women should be garbed in tailormades. Feather-stitching, St. Gall embroideries lend a romantic air to the most vaporous and ethereal of gowns of which even a Gainsborough lady might have dreamt. Like snow flowers they flutter, luminously unreal, in summer twilights; they can only be described in tones hushed and subdued and one feels that any description of them should be preceded by the fairytale « Once upon a time... »

Snowy skirts, delicious furbelows... By night, beautiful women today are contrasting truly feminine illogicality and unreality with the grim facts of our times...

It is so difficult to find words to express such apparitions! Only a painter could do justice to the ravishing creations in St. Gall embroidered fabrics like Jeanne Lanvin's « Saxe » and « Porcelaine ».

Models by Balmain, Maggy Rouf, Dior, Jacques Fath vie one another in beauty.

Spirit world or reality... reminiscence?... A large organdie flounce swathed round a diminutive waist, edged with velvet flowers; the same flowers repeated in the filigree, blurred like a distant refrain. One shoulder strap held by a nosegay... marguerites, edelweiss... dream flowers culled along the by-ways of fantasy and caprice.

Here a flower-like organdie gown by Lucien Lelong would have ravished the heart of Beau Brummell. It must be worn against a setting of quiet waters and fountains, on green lawns. A tight, demure little bodice, buttoned up the back; a skirt of vaporous squares, through which « her little toe peeps in and out » fashioned by a poet's hand...

Robert Piguet, the magician, has created this white gown. An immensely blossoming skirt of dotted Swiss organdie billows out from a tight-fitting, low-cut bodice of navy blue dotted white. My description falls short of reality! The shoulders are swathed and blurred under the foam of a feather-stitch edging held by a small bow of surah. The hem, flounced and piped, is a festoon of similar small bows... Surely this is Versailles and Louis XV? Prince Charming, moonlight... until midnight strikes and the dream vanishes.

Organdies softly draping the bust, low-cut styles disclosing slim shoulders, Gainsborough daintiness: organdies froth and billow, reveal embroideries; demure muslins shake out their folds to the air of a waltz or quadrille. This is dreamland...

Deliciously ephemeral, by their very demureness and crispness most alluring, picture gowns have come back to us; at their side, satins and brocades appear heavy and ungracious. A reminiscence of nights of old, the season's gowns shine and flow in the night, a symbol of reascent joy.

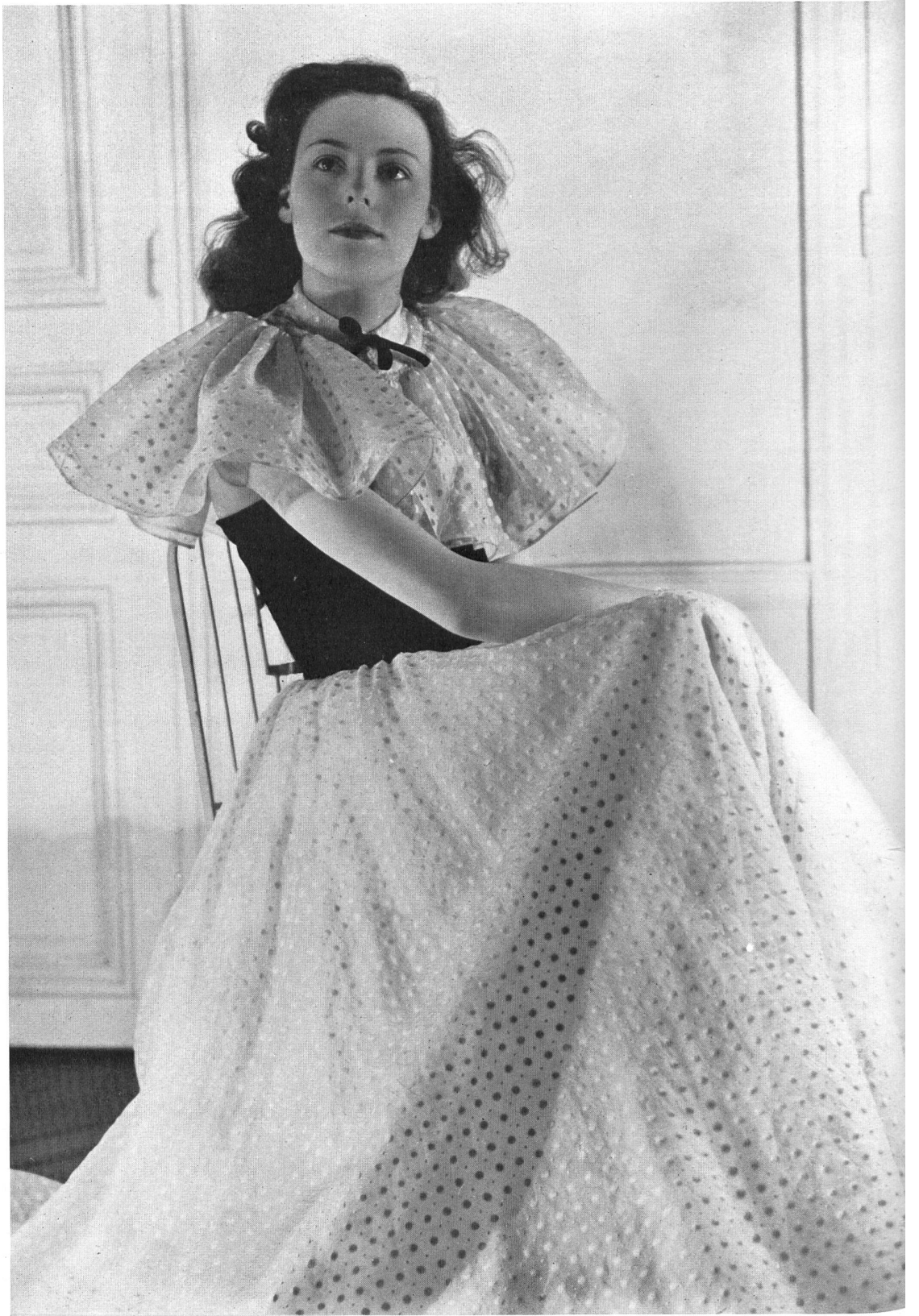

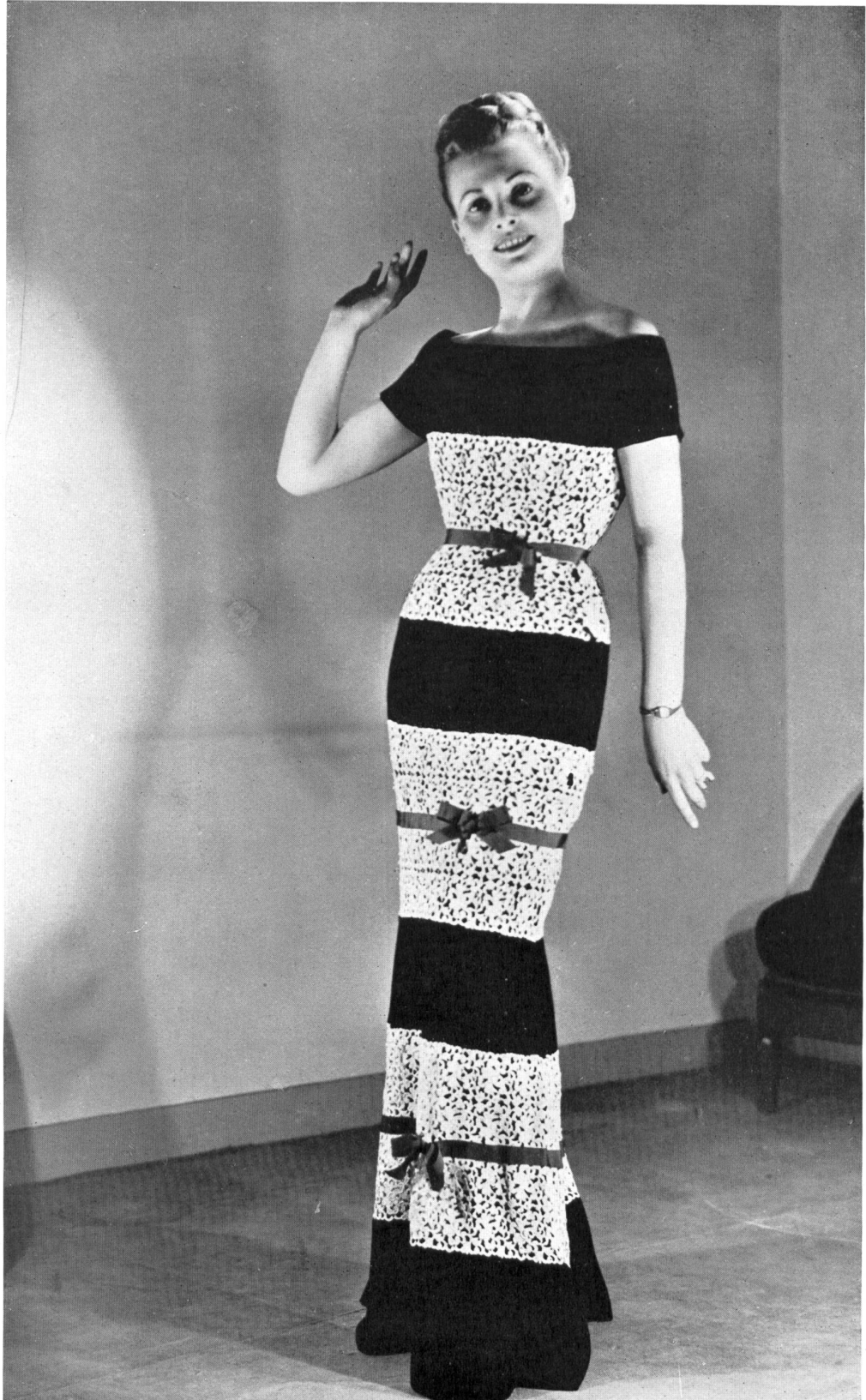

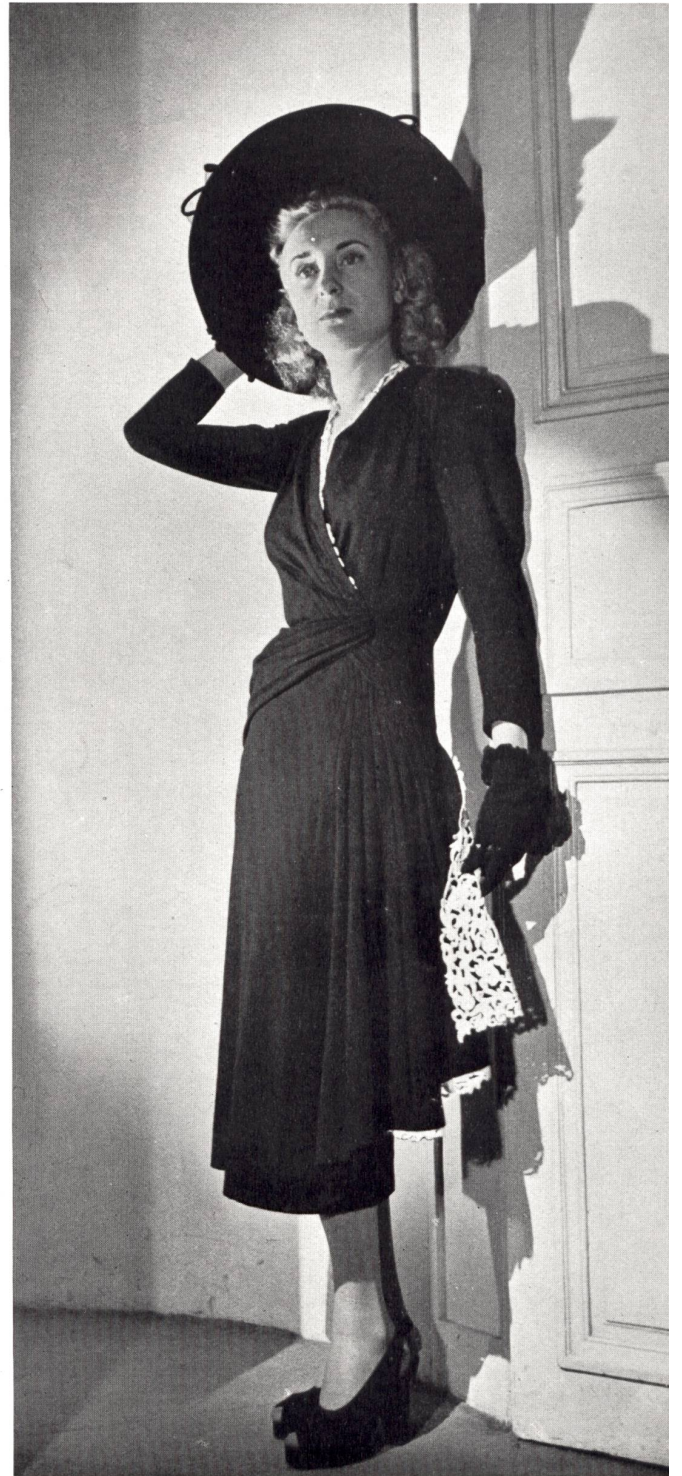
