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Switzerland's foreign trade and textiles in 1952

Although last year proved rather disappointing in certain sectors of the textile industry in Switzerland, the situation of the industry as a whole is far from giving cause for anxiety and can even be considered as favourable. In fact, industrial output, calculated according to the number of man-hours, although not quite coming up to the maximum level recorded in 1951 was not below that of 1948, a year of great prosperity. There was even a slight increase between the first and the second quarter of 1952. Figures for overtime show a degree of employment still appreciably above normal. However, the volume of work in the industry varies quite considerably from one branch to the next.

At right, we are quoting some figures from Switzerland's balance of trade for the past two years, compared with those of 1948, a year of great activity, and 1938, the last year before the war, together with the figures for exports of Swiss textile products.


