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Swiss Industries Fair, Basel

Within the framework of this vast exhibition of Swiss industry where Switzerland's newest products are centralized to give an impressive display of Swiss production, the textile industry obtains an outstanding opportunity of revealing what it can offer to a large circle of buyers from Switzerland itself and from foreign countries as well. In the course of forty years, the industry in question has developed its participation in the Swiss Industries Fair to the position of an industrial display the importance of which extends far beyond the frontiers of Switzerland itself.

In addition, 1956 will see the participation of the textile machinery industry, which alternates every second year with the machine tool industry, and which will present a complete range of the latest kinds of machinery produced by this industry. In this way the forthcoming exhibition will enable visitors to obtain an excellent idea of manufacturing activities in the textile industry right from the raw materials up to the finished products.

On behalf of the exhibitors and the Fair Management I extend herewith to all those interested in the textile industry a cordial invitation to visit the Swiss Industries Fair 1956.
