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Main Events – a Selection

Lavorando sulle carte. Autrici e autori della Svizzera italiana nel secondo Novecento ('Working on paper: authors from Italian-speaking Switzerland in the second half of the 20th century')

16./17.01.2013

In the Swiss National Science Foundation project *Pratiche d'autore* (2010–2014) three doctoral students investigated authorial practices in the first works by Anna Felder, Plinio Martini and Giovanni Orelli. Over the course of two study days for students and lecturers, other doctoral students presented aspects of their current research into Italian-speaking Swiss writers. Working on materials from the Swiss Literary Archives (SLA) and others, participants gained an insight into the linguistic and stylistic development of contemporary authors. The partners of the event were the universities of Zurich and Fribourg and the Swiss central office for continuing education. Materials related to the lectures were presented in an exhibition of the same name that accompanied the study days.

The ironically elaborate precision of Robert Walser's prose is closer to spoken language than it might at first glance appear. The spoken word ensemble "Bern ist überall" ('Bern is everywhere') brought Walser to life. The evening, which gathered Guy Krneta, Gerhard Meister, Beat Sterchi and Christian Brantschen together at the NL, was conceived by the SLA in association with the Robert Walser Center.

Museum Night in Bern: Switzerland sings and dances

For Museum Night in Bern, the NL was transformed into a venue for song and dance. The children's dance group of the Zollikofen/Münchenbuchsee traditional costume society performed folk dances, while the Fanta5 collective showed excerpts from its new work. The Museum of Music Automats from Seewen, canton of Solothurn, was the guest in the exhibition gallery. Urs Richle read from his book *Das taube Herz*. Guided tours introduced documents on the music from the NL's collections. The event was rounded off with three performances by the Bernese singer and instrumentalist Nadja Stoller.

The work of Cendrars in the Bibliothèque de la Pléiade

13.6.2013

The publication of the *Ceuvres autobiographiques complètes* marked the entry of Blaise Cendrars, whose literary estate is held by the SLA, into the *Bibliothèque de la Pléiade*, thus conclusively according his work classic status. At a formal event to mark the occasion, editor Claude Leroy, programme director Hugues Pradier and Jean-Frédéric Jauslin, Director of the Federal Office of Culture, paid tribute to the author, his work, and the edition.

“Eine andere Welt tut sich auf” (‘Another world opens up’): Laure Wyss evening

26.6.2013

To mark the complete description of the archive of Laure Wyss (1913–2002), the SLA devoted an evening to the “grand old lady” of Swiss literature. Barbara Kopp provided an introduction to her life and work. Franziska Kolp chaired the evening and presented some treasures from the archive, while Silvia Jost read out some unpublished texts.

28.8.2013

Christoph Geiser’s writing is the product of often heterogeneous processes: material might begin as a story and be set aside for a while, only to re-emerge in an entirely different context. He makes notes and sketches, writes things down and crosses them out, rewords them, adds to them – and then consigns them to the wastepaper basket. Michael Schläfli talked to the author about his writing process. The evening was chaired by Corinna Jäger-Trees.

Georgia’s foreign minister visits the National Library

12./13.9.2013

As part of a working visit to Federal Councillor and Head of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA) Didier Burkhalter, Georgia’s foreign minister Maia Panjikidze toured the Swiss Literary Archives and then joined Didier Burkhalter for a visit to the Centre Dürrenmatt Neuchâtel. Maia Panjikidze holds a degree in German and has a wide knowledge of Swiss literature, in particular the works of Max Frisch.

“La Prose du Transsibérien” by Blaise Cendrars and Sonia Delaunay

19.10.–16.11.2013

The first “livre simultané”, *Prose du Transsibérien et de la Petite Jehanne de France*, published by Blaise Cendrars and Sonia Delaunay-Terk in 1913, was one of the most important artists’ books of the 20th century. The exhibition presented one of the few originals, which is in the collection of the Swiss National Library, and placed it in the context of other documents from the archive of Blaise Cendrars.

Literature – Publisher – Archive: publishing and publishers’ archives from a literary studies perspective

14./15.11.2013

The SLA’s international colloquium shed light on publishers’ archives, a new area of acquisition and research. Discussions, outline presentations and actual case studies offered an initial survey of the topic. Taking part were the authors Dieter Bachmann, Friederike Kretzen and Urs Widmer; Egon Ammann, Urs Engeler, Renate Nagel and Daniel Kampa from the publishing side; Jan Bürger, Rainer Diederichs and Klaus G. Saur from the world of academia and, from the SLA, Irmgard Wirtz Eybl and Magnus Wieland. The Suhrkamp research college in Marbach was represented by three invited doctoral students headed by Anna Kinder.

Balades avec le Minotaure

6.12.2013–9.3.2014

Balades avec le Minotaure is the second major exhibition by the Centre Dürrenmatt Neuchâtel (CDN) devoted to the topic of the labyrinth. The vernissage celebrated the reopening of the CDN after a five-month closure for maintenance work. With a design inspired by the architecture of the amphitheatre, the exhibition presents key scenes of the Minotaur myth, as interpreted by Dürrenmatt and other important artists including Goya, Richard Long, Pablo Picasso, Max von Moos, Paul Klee, Varlin and André Masson.
