## Entomologica Basiliensia

**Instructions to the authors**

1. Entomologica Basiliensia is a publication of the Natural History Museum Basel and only original contributions dealing with material of this Museum will be published.
2. Entomologica Basiliensia is reserved for the publication of systematic and faunistic works on Insects and related Arthropods.
3. All submitted manuscripts must be typed on standard size pages ( $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  inches, A4), double spaced, with sufficient margin.
4. Publications should have the following format: *title*, author's *first name* (only initials) and *surname*, *abstract*, *text* of the article, *abstract* in a second language if necessary, *acknowledgements* and *bibliography*.
5. *Latin names* will be underlined with a wavy line (*italics*), *names* of authors cited will be underlined twice (CAPITAL) only when the citation *occurs* in the bibliography, *titles* will be underlined once (**bold type**).
6. *Paragraphs* should be indented several spaces.
7. *Bibliographic references* cited in the text should appear as follows: Zwick & Sivec (1980) or (Zwick & Sivec, 1980). Species references in the synonymy should be *indented* and written in the following order:  
Dytiscus sharpi Wehncke, 1875, Stett, Ent. Zeit. 36: 500.
8. The following abbreviations and punctuation will be used in the text: n.fam., n.subfam., n.sp., n.ssp., n.comb., n.n., n.syn., n.stat.; 5.4 m (meters), 5.4 cm, 5.4 mm, 5.4 mi (miles), 3000' (feet).
9. The figures will be drawn in ink, numbered (1, 2, 3, etc. and not 1a, 1b, 2a, etc. unless appropriate) and accompanied by a scale. They should be assembled into plates which can be reduced to page size ( $11 \times 18$  cm) leaving an appropriate space for the legend (1–2 cm).
10. All *figures* should be cited in the text at least once.
11. *Legends* for plates should appear as follows:  
Figs 1–10: 1, Dytiscus latissimus F., Aedeagus in ventral view. 2, D. marginalis L., right antenna. 3, D. semisulcatus Müll., ...  
or  
Figs 1–10: 1–3. Dytiscus latissimus F. 1, Aedeagus in ventral view. 2, left elytron. 3, right antenna. 4–5. D. marginalis L. 4, ...  
or  
Figs 1–10: 1–3. Antennae: 1, Dytiscus latissimus F. 2, D. marginalis L. 3, D. semisulcatus Müll. 4–5. Aedeagus. 4, ...
12. *References in the bibliography* should be alphabetical and must appear at least once in the text. The author's name will be underlined twice, the title of the publication and the vol. of the journal once with a wavy line. The year of publication will be placed in parenthesis followed by a colon.
13. All manuscripts not conforming to these instructions will be returned to the author.

## NATURALIST'S DIRECTORY

This is a directory of the naturalists of the world. Data of over 10 000 persons are already registered. The fields of interest biology, ecology, zoology, botany, ornithology, entomology, rocks, minerals, fossils and conservation are represented.

Part II. (Directory of Plant Collectors and Identifiers, Part III. (Directory of Bird Watchers, Part IV. (Directory of Field Biologists), will be issued in 1982. Part V. (Directory of Rock, Mineral and Fossil Collectors), and finally, Part VI. (Directory: Subject Geographical and Name Index) in 1983.
